H'heads schools get ready to strategize

HORSEHEADS The Horseheads school board has approved the makeup of the team that will develop the district's strategic plan for the next 10-15 years.

The board approved a 60member core team Monday.

"The consultants (PLC Associates) gave us a range of 40 to 60," Superintendent Ralph Marino Jr. said. "We wanted to make sure all stakeholder groups in the district fit in. This is a large district. We felt we wanted to get as many people involved from different sectors in the community."

The core team will consist of two school board members, three members of cenadministration, an administrator from the high

school, middle school, intermediate school and elementary school, seven parents, between four and six business leaders, two senior citizens, two teachers each from the elementary, middle, intermediate and high schools, three special area teachers, four teaching assistants, seven support staff, five community members, seven at-large members and two others to be determined later.

Only five slots have already been filled on the team. Board president and vice president Brian Lynch and Mike Buck will represent the school board, while Alice Learn, Judy Christiansen and Mike Stuart will represent the central administration.

The rest of the team will be filled in a variety of ways. The




